COMPOUNDING OPTIONS FOR PAIN, WOUND AND SCAR COURSE OUTLINE

Compounding Options for Pain, Wound and Scar is a 15 hour application-based course.

The overall goal of this application based program is to provide the pharmacist and/or technician the ability to learn about pain, its physical and behavioral

components, the mechanisms of pain, the treatment of pain both pharmacologic and non-pharmacologic, and how to compound unique dosage forms to meet the needs of the patient in pain. In addition the participant will learn the techniques compatible with USP 795 in the provision of quality pharmaceutical preparations and applicable DEA rules. Practical compounding case studies will be presented including the management of painful conditions, and wound and scar treatments.

Upon completing this program, the participant should be able to:

- Define what is pain?
- Contrast Acute pain from chronic pain.
- Differentiate between neuropathic pain and nociceptive pain.
- Classify pharmacologic agents which are useful in the treatment of neuropathic pain.
- Select three agents which have different mechanisms and are useful for the topical treatment of pain.
- Establish the compounding treatment options when treating a sunburn, a first degree burn and a second degree burn.
- Offer topical treatment choices when treating a wound especially a chronic wound.
- Develop a formulation for treating scars.
- Explain the dosage considerations based on the pharmacokinetic parameters of different narcotics like codeine, morphine, hydrocodone and hydromorphone: dose, frequency, route.
- Offer a solution to a physician who needs a high potency oral narcotic which can be delivered in a small volume.
- Identify special DEA rules as they apply to compounding pain medications.
